

Tour 15 - Auto & Motorcycle Clubs Scenic Touring Along Roads Less Traveled



Hwy. 70, Feather River National Scenic Byway

Drive quiet rural byways and backcountry roads with breathtaking mountain vistas and charming small towns.

Plumas County is crisscrossed with backroads winding through rugged canyons, fragrant pine forests and pristine mountain meadows. Along these paved and unpaved routes you can expect to find an abundance of geological formations, historical sites, wildlife, waterfalls, vibrant seasonal color, and crystal clear lakes and streams.

The driving tour brochures of Plumas County's small communities, byways and forests offer an overview of what you will see. Contact the Plumas County Visitors Bureau (800-326-2247 or www.plumascounty.org) to obtain free copies of these self-guided tour brochures.

Many annual events and live concerts are scheduled during the off-season (October through May). Contact the Visitors Bureau for information on events scheduled during the time of your visit.

Plumas County is easily accessible from every direction. Highways 70 and 89 pass through the entire county. Travel routes are detailed in the free Plumas County Visitors Guide. Contact the Plumas County Visitors Bureau for a copy or to purchase a county map.

Day 1 - Arrival in Plumas County: Graeagle and Quincy

 The village of **Graeagle** features an array of identical red buildings that once were homes for workers at the former lumber mill. Today they house shops and services, and the nearby Graeagle Mill Pond is a popular spot for relaxation. Explore the shops and galleries in this quaint town (allow 45 minutes.)

 **OPTION: Plumas-Eureka State Park** (530-836-2380) Open 9am-4pm in summer; when staff is available during the rest of the year.

 **Travel west** for 5 miles on road A-14. Advance appointment required for the museum during off-season. Free admission. (allow 1 hour)

The museum and park are located at the foot of Eureka Peak, which produced some \$25 million in gold from hard-rock mining during the late 1880s. Both are within the tiny Gold Rush town of Johnsville, which preserves the rich heritage of the area's gold mining legacy. The indoor-outdoor complex includes a miner's boarding house, the five-story Mohawk Stamp Mill, a blacksmith shop and a restored miner's home.

 **From the museum**, continue west on A-14 for a few blocks to see Johnsville's historic buildings.

 **Plumas County Museum** 500 Jackson St. (530-283-6320). Open 8am - 5pm Tuesday- Saturday year-round. Admission \$2 adults, \$1 for ages 12-17, free to children under 12 (allow 1 hour.)

 **Shopping** in Quincy - W. Main St. and adjacent side streets, Plumas Pines Shopping Center at Hwy. 70 and Quincy Junction Rd. and East Quincy along Hwy. 70. Art galleries, antique and thrift shops, gift shops, and stores selling books, clothing, candy, toys and more are located along this route.

 **Evening entertainment** can also include a movie at the historic Town Hall Theatre on Main St. or a community concert or show (depending on schedule.) Athletic and other events are often available at Feather River College and Quincy High School. You can also workout at the Feather River Fitness Center or try out your skill at the bowling alley.

The Town Hall Theatre is open Thurs-Mon and offers a movie starting at 7pm, with a matinee at 4pm on Sunday only. (530-283-1140)

La Sierra Lanes bowling alley is open evenings seven days a week. (530-283-1633)

Beckwourth-Antelope Lake, Indian Valley Route** - 75 mile, 4 hour route, closed with first snow-fall.

Hwy. 89, Volcanic Legacy All American Road

Bucks Lake Loop - Quincy** - 37 miles, 1-1/2 hour paved route, closed with first snowfall. There is no printed brochure for this route.

Feather River National Scenic Byway - 130 mile, 3.5 hour route on Hwy. 70, an all-weather highway.

Frenchman Lake - Dixie Valley Loop** - 75 mile, 4 hour loop tour on paved and gravel roads, closed with first snowfall.

Historic Town Sites On The Plumas National Forest** - 30 miles, 2 hours along unpaved roads, closed with first snow.


Humboldt Summit - Humbug Valley Loop** - 69 miles, 4 hours, closed with first snowfall.

Indian Valley - Antelope Lake Loop - 33 miles, 1 1/2 hours, paved all-weather road.

Lakes Basin - Gold Lake Highway Loop** - 39 mile, 1 1/2 hour paved loop, closed with first snowfall. There is no printed brochure for this route.

Volcanic Legacy All American Road - Lassen Park - Chester-Lake Almanor Loop - 93 mile, 4 hour, paved all-weather road, except the 29 mile portion through Lassen Park which closes with the first snowfall. The south entrance to the park up to the Kohm Yah-mah-nee Visitor Center is open year round and is just 4 1/2 miles north of Hwy 36. This route is the southern terminus of the newly named All American Road, which continues northward to Crater Lake, Oregon.


Quincy-LaPorte-Johnsville Route** - 66 mile, 4 hour route, closed with first snow.
