Organize a corporate meeting in the autumn to take advantage of spectacular fall foliage.

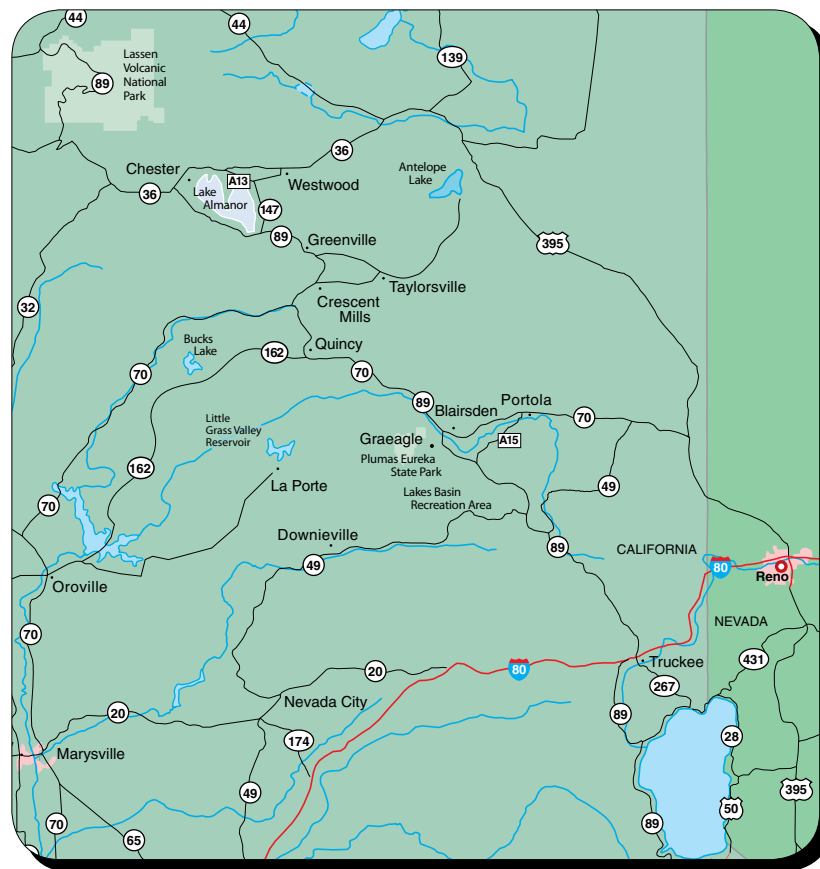
Plan a real retreat for your staff in the mountains of the Northern Sierra. Combine business with outdoor fun in a relaxing, rural setting.

With its four distinct seasons, beautiful forests and quaint communities, Plumas County offers the perfect setting for a productive and memorable corporate retreat. Located in northeastern California where the Sierra Nevada and Cascade mountain ranges meet, Plumas County is easily accessible, yet provides a place of solitude where one can focus on the business at hand without the stress and distractions of an urban environment.

Depending on the size of your group, there are many choices for lodging, dining facilities and meeting rooms. The few sites included on this list will accommodate groups of 100 guests or more. There are numerous other sites in the county (not listed) that can accommodate smaller groups. Catering and meeting rooms also are available in most communities with nearby lodging.



The date of your retreat will determine the sightseeing, outdoor activities and entertainment opportunities appropriate for your group. Local educators associated with Feather River College, located in Quincy, as well as other local experts, can give lectures, tours, classes, workshops and video presentations on topics of interest to your attendees. Potential topics include forestry, the timber industry, yoga, art, music, health, history, dance, outdoor sports, birding, tourism, and geology – to name a few.

Many annual events and live concerts are scheduled during the off-season (October through May), including small town festivals, sled dog races, historic longboard races, Christmas tree cutting, snowmobile races and poker runs.  **Dining:** For meals not included in your retreat package, see restaurant listings. Catering is also available.

Attractions:

Plumas County Museum 500 Jackson St. Quincy (530-283-6320). Open 8am - 5pm Tuesday-Saturday year-round. Admission \$2 adults, \$1 for ages 12-17, free to children under 12 (allow 1 hour).

Plumas-Eureka State Park (530-836-2380) Open 8am-4pm in summer; when staff is available during the rest of the year. Travel (west) for 5 miles on road A-14 (out of Graeagle). Advance appointment required for the museum during off-season. Admission \$3 adults, \$1 for ages 6-16, outdoor attractions are free. (allow 1 hour)

Western Pacific Railroad Museum at Portola. (530-832-4131) Open seasonally April through October from 10 am to 5 pm daily. Advance appointment advised during off-season (allow 45 minutes).

Self-guided auto tours - Brochures with maps for various driving tours are available from the Plumas County Visitors Bureau.

Nakoma Golf Resort (530-832-5067) See its unique Frank Lloyd Wright design.

Golf Courses: there are a total of eleven golf courses in Plumas County. Pick your favorites and enjoy some of the finest golf in the high sierra. Contact the Visitors Bureau (800-326-2247) for a complete list of courses.


Snow sports, including skiing, snowmobiling, snowshoeing, ice fishing and sled dog races, are popular during winter in Plumas County.

Shopping:

Chester/Lake Almanor- explore the shops and galleries along Main Street.

Quincy - W. Main St. and adjacent side streets, Plumas Pines Shopping Center at Hwy. 70 and Quincy Junction Rd. and East Quincy along Hwy. 70. Art galleries, antique and thrift shops, gift shops, and stores selling books, clothing, candy, sporting goods and more are located along this route.

Graeagle/Blairsdan - explore the shops and galleries in this quaint historic logging community.

 **Evening entertainment** can include a movie at the historic Town Hall Theatre on Main St. in Quincy or a community concert or show (depending on schedule.) Athletic and other events are often available at Feather River College and Quincy High School. You can also workout or unwind in a spa at the Feather River Fitness Center or try out your skill at the bowling alleys in Chester and Quincy.



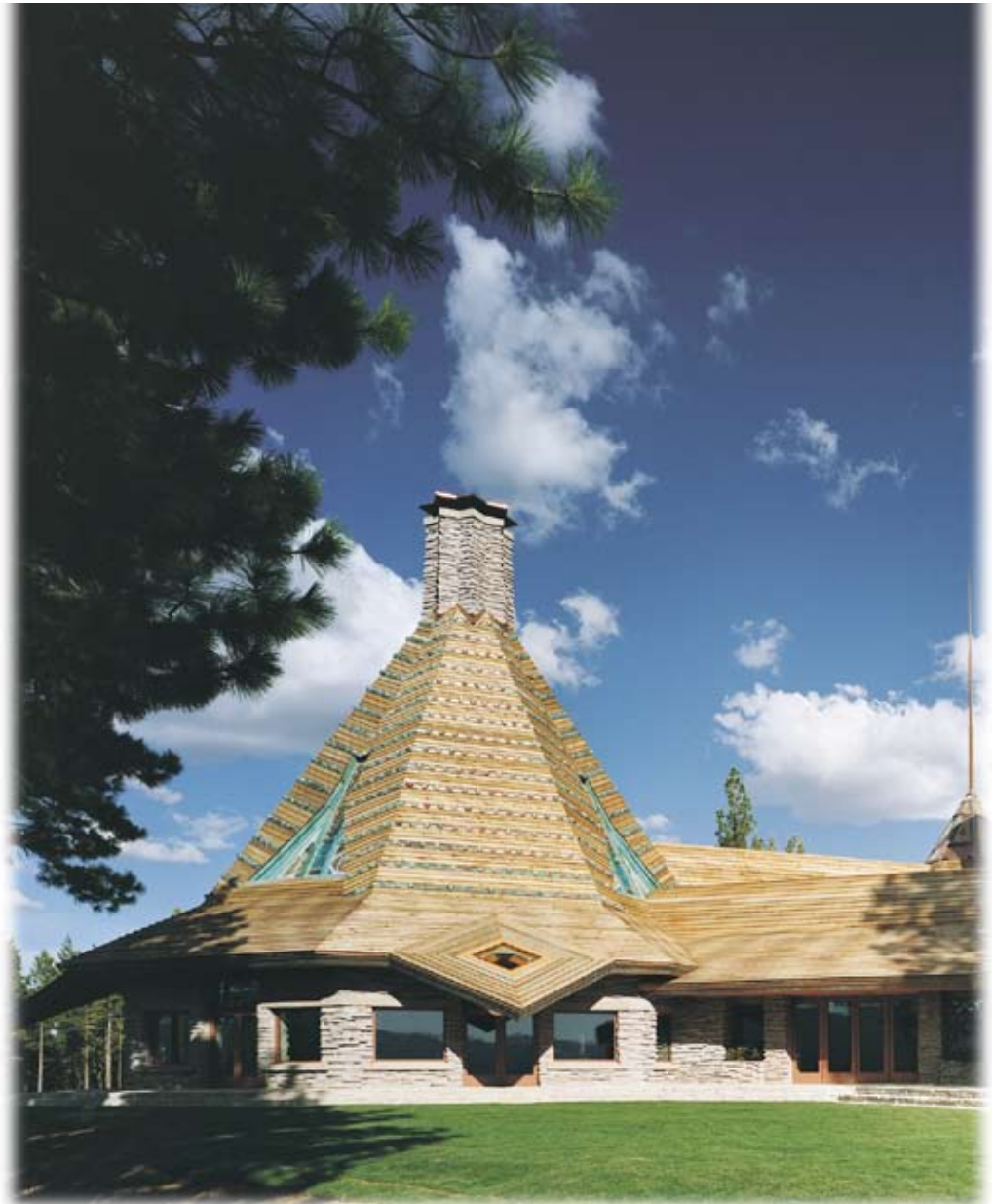
Quincy and Chester Libraries are open until 8pm on Thursdays. (530-283-6310, 258-2742)
